5	Admissions Criteria	<i>Description of admission factors</i>
	Overall admissions criteria are based on the entire record of the applicant and availability of departmental resources. Admission will be based upon the following criteria: 1) Hold a four-year baccalaureate degree from a college or university of recognized standing (i.e., a degree recognized as as equivalent to a baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution in the U.S.), overall transcript evaluation, and grade point ratio in the last 60 hours of coursework. 2) Show promise of intellectual and academic ability, a minimum of three letters of recommendation from persons capable of judging the applicant's capabilities, and an evaluation of the Statement of Purpose essay. 3) Submit, with application, scores on the General Test of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), which will be evaluated in the manner that complies with House Bill 1641. 4) Additional at the program level, an applicant from another country seeking admission to graduate studies must demonstrate the ability to read, write, speak and understand the English language. Prospective students whose native language is not English must take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), which is administered by the Educational Testing Service in over 200 centers around the world. All applicants from non-English speaking countries must present a computer based TOEFL score of at least 213 to be admitted to graduate studies at the University.
