**Comment**

#2: Graduation Rates. The 50% figure is misleading. For some reason, the breakdown data indicate that this estimate includes many students who left the program (for a variety of different reasons) before completing PhD requirements. We do not think this value is an accurate reflection of the true graduation rate for the PSYC doctoral program. The values for the CLPY (100%) and IOPY (80%) doctoral programs are closer to the "true" percentage who graduate within 10 years.
