SUBJECT: Deletion of Nonprofit Management Concentration from MPSA Curriculum

The Master of Public Service and Administration (MPSA) program recently added a track in nonprofit management, effective AY 2014-15. This is one of three tracks from which MPSA students are required to choose. Additionally, students have the option to declare a concentration from a number of areas, including nonprofit management. The nonprofit management concentration was implemented years ago, before the creation of the nonprofit management track. The addition of the nonprofit management track now makes the nonprofit management concentration a redundant and unnecessary feature of the curriculum. The MPSA program would therefore like to delete the nonprofit concentration and have students interested in nonprofits instead follow the nonprofit management track.
